How citizens can contribute to biodiversity research?

Objective

Improve the quality of the information associated with some traditional varieties stored at the Spanish Vegetable Seed Bank of CITA (BGHZ) by growing them in their region of origin.

Methods

Two networks of "Ambassadors of Seeds" were stablished:

- Traditional non-professional growers
- Educational community

In order to valorize local varieties of legumes and vegetables by growing traditional seeds from the seedbank BGHZ and collecting accurate data.





Ambassadors of biodiversity: a participatory project to valorize traditional seeds.

Main results

- ✓ A total of 104 vegetable landraces belonging to 12 crops were cultivated and studied by the network formed by 43 growers.
- ✓ A total of **59 seed samples** belonging to **30** different **accessions** of the **2 crops** (broad bean and pea) were studied by the network formed by **31 school centers**.
